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REPORT OF THE COUNCIL Year ended 31st August 1995

The members of the Council present their report and the annual accounts of the Association for the year ended 31st August 1995.

Activities

The principal activities of the Association are in the provision of facilities for the printing and distribution of Bibles and Bible based literature and in the promotion of the Christian religion by holding conventions for Christian education. The activities also include giving support to congregations of Jehovah's Witnesses and to others in connection with their spiritual and material welfare, within the charitable purposes of the Association.

Financial Results

There was a surplus of income on ordinary activities of £2,156,215 (1994 £2,133.596). Donations to Watch Tower Society amounted to £4,564,629 (1994 from Watch Tower Society £2,515,000) and this created a deficit for the year of £2,408,414 (1994 surplus of £4,648,596).

It was necessary for the Association to support, by way of donation, the work of Watch Tower Society on which considerable demands have been made to finance the activities of Jehovah's Witnesses overseas.

Review of Developments

Capital expenditure on fixed assets has been incurred during this financial year totalling £3,348,205 and is analysed in note 8 on page 9 of the accounts. This includes a total of £2,961,100 for the acquisition of land and buildings in Greece to be used for the construction of several Kingdom Halls and an Assembly Hall.

Council members' responsibilities in respect of the preparation of accounts

NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS Year ended 31st August 1995

1. STATUS OF THE ASSOCIATION

The Association is an unlimited company without share capital, incorporated under the Companies Acts 1908 and 1913 (No.136726) and is a Registered Charity (No.216647).

The Association has close connections with Watch Tower Bible and Tract Society (Watch Tower Society). The branch address in Britain of Watch Tower Society is the registered office of the Association and both charities have common and related objectives.

2. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

- a) The accounts are prepared under the historical cost convention. The Association has presented an Income and Expenditure Account which does not strictly adhere to the formats required by Schedule 4 to the Companies Act 1985 but has instead presented the account in a form which includes headings which are relevant to its activities thereby enabling it to show a true and fair view.
- b) Depreciation is provided on fixed assets to write off the cost over the following periods:-

Land	No depreciation
Freehold properties and developments	50 years
Leasehold properties	15-50 years
Fixtures and fittings	10 years
Plant and machinery	7 years
Convention equipment	7 years

- c) The District Convention costs do not include provision for depreciation of convention equipment as this is included in the overall charge for depreciation of fixed assets.
- d) The quoted investments have all been donated. These investments are shown at the donated values of £261,395. The market values at 31 August 1995 was £283,571.

3. PERSONNEL

- a) The Association has no employees but engages only voluntary workers, providing them with free board, lodging and an allowance for personal and other expenses. During the year there was an average of 255 (240 in 1994) persons engaged.
- b) All personnel, including the Members of the Council, are paid on the same basis. Those engaged in the usual work of the Association are required to live in the Association's premises. The total cash allowances, expenses payments and value of board and lodging did not exceed £3,010 during the year for any one person.
